We want our children to be independent, motivated learners that can plan their own learning and accept a challenge! We begin to teach even the youngest children metacognitive strategies through the use of our 'Plan, Do, Review' cycle which we model by 'thinking out loud' throughout Independent Learning time. Children progress from verbally planning their learning to being able to record their thinking on paper.

We use stories as a stimulus for topics, we have our much-loved daily story time, we read and retell stories together during independent learning, and we use books linked to other areas of learning such as mathematical development, seasons and nature. Through exposure to rich language and plot structures, our children expand their vocabularies, improve

their listening comprehension, and develop firm early literacy skills.
