Important Request - Sun Hats, Sunscreen and Water Bottles

During the summer term, please make sure that items of clothing are clearly named, that sun hats are brought in, sunscreen is applied and water bottles provided. If the children are visiting Forest school it may be wise to apply some insect repellent too before coming into school.

Safety at Drop-Off and Collection Time

To keep everyone safe please following these simple steps at drop off and collection time (and please ensure that anyone else dropping off or collecting your child is aware of this too):

Parking - please **do not** park on the double yellow lines, the yellow zigzag lines, on the bend or outside Elstree School entrance. When parking please take care not to mount the pavement, especially when pedestrians are walking along the path.

Turning – please do not turn around in the school gates, entrances to the staff car parks, or further down the road at the grass triangle point as this is a private road. If you do need to turn, please find a safe alternative place and remain courteous to other road users and residents - **do not use the private road triangle.**
